
## Official Funeral Service For Paramount Chief of Ovaherero People



### Tribute to Ombara Otjitambi

Ombara Otjitambi: Kombunda ondiro joMbara Otjitambi, Dr. Kuaima Riruako, Ombara Otjjitambi Adv. Vekuii Rukoro otjazikirue me Hungiro mombura ndji 2014; Omundu Omukuendata uondjiuo nene jaMateve jaHango Karukua kaHango; kuihe omuatje uaHijamberimuna uongombe ja Tjombe tjaMukuandongo ohamungira ajazepa tjandje jaurozongama; ongombe jetu oningandu ndjaendere morutjindo ruaKamatjene Kozombuzovatua nderi ongombe jaNgamune jahonini.

Eje uakuaterua moTjiwarongo tjorutenda; ooKongombe ja Kambirongo ondjeo ndjiri ko Muhona ua Kaoko; mombura indij 1954, tjijari 11 Tjikukutu. Early life and Education: *Ombara Otjitambi Advocate Vekuii Reinhard Rukoro* was born in Otjiwarongo, a farming town in central Namibia — then known as South West Africa on the 11 November 1954. His parents are Mr. Hijavara Kuhanga and the late Ms. Ndjizehinga Rukoro. He was raised by his grandmother Ms. Wilhemine Kaondeka Menjono in the village of Okondomba in Omatjete area in the Erongo region. His maternal siblings are Mrs. Uaengua Veronica Vihanga and Mr. Kazandundova Kuhunga. He grew up in an extended family of close to 10 siblings which included among others the following people: Mr. Mbambati Menjono; Mr. Juku Tjazuko; Mrs. Selma Mapoha; Mrs. Rukee Karumbu; Mr. Tjipundi Rukoro; Ms. Mbapewa Juliane Mbundu, Mrs. Uparura Vihanga; Mr. Verikenda Rukoro; Ms. Mbazuva Rukoro and Mr.Gabriel Rukoro.

Ombara Otjitambi attended primary school in Swakopmund and Karibib, and secondary school at Döbra. His school mates were among others Messrs. Blue Karimbwe. Late Erenfried "Bankrotier" Kandiimuine; Rukee "Bankrotier" Tjingaete, Bernhardt "Bankrotier" Zaaruka; Dr. HKuiri Tjipangandjara; Stouter Ochurub and Johanness Tokwe. In 1980 he started tertiary education and obtained an LLB (Honours) degree from the University of Warwick (Coventry, England) in 1983, and an LLM degree from the Washington College of Law (Washington, D.C., United States) in 1987. He was a great soccer and rugby player and a great boxer too; he was known as Rocky in the boxing circles.

A seasoned politician: Advocate Rukoro joined the South West Africa National Union (SWANU) in 1975 and became its secretary-general but left with a group of dissidents in 1978 to form the South West Africa National Union Progressives (SWANU-P). He returned to SWANU, again became secretary-general in 1984, and the party's president in 1989. SWANU, like SWANU-P, merged into the Namibia National Front (NNF) prior to the 1989 elections that preceded Namibia's independence. Advocate Rukoro became president of the NNF and took the only seat gained by the party. He thus became a member of the Constituent Assembly of Namibia where he was one of the main drafters of Namibia's Constitution.

When Namibia officially became independent in March 1990, Advocate Rukoro became deputy justice minister — a post he held until 1995. Politically, Advocate Rukoro switched allegiance to the ruling South West African Peoples' Organisation (SWAPO) in the mid-1990s, and the lawyer served as the country's attorney general until 2000, before pursuing a corporate career.

Empowering and influential corporate leader: Advocate Rukoro was an influential businessman after his political career went on hold. He was chairman of the former national carrier Air Namibia until 2004, while serving as the Managing Director for Sanlam Namibia (2000 -2004), He also served as a Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for First National Bank Namibia (2006-2013). Thereafter Advocate Rukoro was also CEO of the Meat Cooperation of Namibia (Meatco) organization between 2014-2017.

OvaHerero Chieftainship: "Your legacy shall linger on..." After the June 2014 death of Dr. Kuaima Riruako left the position of the Paramount Chieftaincy of the OvaHerero people vacant, Chief Fanuel Tumbee Tjombe acted for a short time. He died weeks after taking the position. In September 2014, Advocate Rukoro was appointed Paramount Chief. He led his tribe for 6 years and a half when he died in a Windhoek Hospital after a short illness on 18 June 2021.

His aspirations and wishes: Ombara Otjitambi was passionate about the "Namibianisation" and localisation drive in all spheres of our economy with the focus of lessening dependence on South Africa and empowering the local operations with skills and building talent. He fought for inclusivity and a prosperous Namibia especially on the land question. Economic Independence of all Namibians and especially the Ovaherero people stating that "ami hivanga okunana otjiuana otjisiona". Poor in the sense that Ovaherero people has been hereto deprived of their ancestral land and worthy possessions. He was an advocating for sustainable development and growth at home with regards to farming and food production.

"Muniovita" amplified our cause of reparations and restorative justice – "Nothing about us without us." In 2017, Ombara Otjitambi Advocate Rukoro and other Herero and Nama leaders filed a class-action lawsuit in New York to try to force Germany to pay reparations, an effort which fell short when the court ruled the principle of sovereign immunity made the case against Germany inadmissible. Ombara Otjitambi Advocate Rukoro used his position as paramount chief to bring attention to the genocide case, remaining a thorn in the side for Germany. When negotiations between Namibia and Germany commenced in 2015 — with the aim of getting Germany to admit the early 20th century killings amounted to genocide and reach some kind of financial settlement — Ombara Otjitambi Advocate Vekui Rukoro consistently rejected Germany's insistence on dealing bilaterally with the Namibian government instead of the affected ethnic groups, insisting on representation. On a visit to Germany in 2016, Ombara Otjitambi said that a German apology not backed by reparations would be an "insult to the intelligence not only of the Namibians and the descendants of the victim communities but to Africans in general."
